Administration & Project Management

Community Engagement

Implementation: action planning and monitoring

One of the challenges for Neighbourhood Planning groups is that while you may have your policies turned into 'planning speak' there may be a gap between what the final policy says and what you had originally intended with the community's voice being lost in translation.

DINT can help you to realise your original intentions in your community, for instance by:

• Working with your group and others in your community to evaluate the Neighbourhood Plan process, what objectives it met or didn't meet

- Identifying which objectives are still important but didn't get included in the plan
- Developing an action plan for community-wide action beyond 'land-use' policies
- Developing a check list for parish councils to consider at each planning application in line with your policies
- Partnering with other groups who have similar goals for support and inspiration
- Providing support on community-led campaigns and communications to achieve your community goals

DiNT also believes that a Neighbourhood Plan becomes most effective when it is truly owned by the community and used for local decision-making routinely by parish and town councils, as well as local groups.
